roberto segre (miland, 1934) is one of the most prominent historians and critics specialized in modern latin-american and caribbean architecture and urbanism, writing more than 30 books and 350 essays on this subject.

professor at buenos aires (1957-1963); at havana (1963-1994) and rio de janeiro (1994-2005). doctor in sciences of art (havana, 1991); in urban and regional planning (rio de janeiro, 1997). visiting professor at columbia (1982); john simon guggenheim fellowship (1985); cullinan professor at rice (1995); provost distinguished professor at usc los angeles (2004). his last book, "XXth century's antillean architecture" obtained the first prize at the ibero-american biennale of architecture and urbanism (lima, 2004).
